CITY OF CHARLES STURT	Future Ready	To increase engagement and work ready skills for young people in FLO (flexible learning options) programs including career exploration, resume writing, interview skills and communication skills. In addition, a wellbeing session will be added to the program to support participants in understanding their strengths and skills to assist in career planning.	\$ 5,000.00
MARIONLIFE COMMUNITY SERVICES INCORPORATED	MarionLIFE Youth Events Team	MarionLIFE Youth Events Team is a continuation of a pilot project that started as a 'Lunchtime Sessions' project in local schools. We are now in a position to offer a mobile youth service largely run by 18–25-year-old volunteers that local schools, youth services and community events can book in to travel to their desired location to provide activities (including sports, games and craft), life skills workshops and free healthy food for young people aged 10-17 years in Marion.	\$ 10,000.00
FINDON HIGH SCHOOL	I Love Coffee Caravan	Findon High School provided a detailed report on the progress on the project to date. Upon the strength of this report and the enthusiasm and commitment to the project Findon High School applied for a second payment to complete this project. The caravan is expected to be completed mid 2022, including relevant council approvals. The second payment is largely to contribute to the generator required for the caravan to set up and trade in areas freely.	\$ 5,000.00
ERRINGTON SPECIAL EDUCATION CENTRE	Sleep intervention program	Sleep deprivation is widely documented as being as contributory factor in dysregulation and disengagement particularly of students with an intellectual disability This program, if successful will address this factor through workshops/research and interventions for families held at the school	\$ 6,500.00
NGUTU COLLEGE LTD	Specialist Access For All	The provision of specialist equipment to complement a sensory and occupational therapy space. We are partnering with Occupational Therapy for Children (OTFC) to provide 2 days of OT services to our high proportion of children with sensory processing disorders, post-traumatic stress disorder, Autism Spectrum Disorder and/or regulation difficulties. We intend to partner with Flinders University to document the project as action research with the intention of OTFC expanding the approach to other school sites. Whilst the project is identified as running for 12 months later in the application, the benefits will be ongoing and the spaces and equipment will be able to be used for many years.	\$ 10,000.00
