



LIONS CLUB OF RICHMOND YOUTH EDUCATION FUND: 2020 - 2021 INTERIM UPDATE (MAY 2021)

As of May 2021, \$46,500 has so far been distributed to local projects through the Lions Club of Richmond Youth Education Fund. These projects all support engagement of children and young people by celebrating education.

THE BROGAS (CITY OF CHARLES STURT)

\$4,999 towards the development of a showcase of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people's stories, history, connection to culture and art during NAIDOC week.

ERRINGTON SPECIAL EDUCATION CENTRE

\$5000 to support the school to set up specific learning/play spaces for students. These spaces will allow students to self regulate their behaviour through structured sensory activities using specific sensory tools and activities supervised by an experienced Occupational Therapist.

FRIENDS OF THE ONE AND ALL SAILING SHIP

\$4,950 contribution to a hands on sail experience for up to 90 young people on the tallship STV One and All.

MARION PRIMARY SCHOOL

\$1,800 Students will meet over term 4 to design and create a mosaic wall. They will work with an Artist in Residence, Carol Hill, who is experienced in Mosaics.

\$500 to support incursions, excursions and cultural activities for the school's Yarning Group, which invites Aboriginal learners and their families to discuss, explore and celebrate culture.

PENNINGTON CHILDREN'S CENTRE

\$4,800 towards a series of incursions.

RAA SOUTH AUSTRALIA

\$5,000 contribution to the third and final year of the License to Work program, which will support a further five students to access driving lessons with accredited RAA instructors.

CUTTING EDGE YOUTH SERVICES AND WARRIAPPENDI SCHOOL

A two term program to learn basic woodwork and handskills in a non-competitive environment. The primary aim is developing a greater sense of awareness of their own skills and the chance to build confidence and resilience while working on both individual and group projects.

FINDON HIGH SCHOOL

\$5000 grant for a coffee caravan initiative, which will engage students in the development of a mobile coffee caravan enterprise which will service the school and local community

WESTPORT PRIMARY SCHOOL

\$2,800 to support students on low incomes to attend the yearly 6/7 Canberra camp.

Funds for the partnership are raised by the dedicated Lions Club of Richmond members and volunteers through their popular Camden Park op shop.
