

Digital Inclusion Grants – The Wyatt Trust

Introduction

Digital inclusion means ensuring everyone can access and use technology and the internet to enhance and improve their daily lives. Digital technology has become an essential part of life, work, learning, accessing essential services and family and social connection.

South Australia has the second lowest rate of digital inclusion in Australia (2021) and some people are more vulnerable to digital exclusion in our state (<u>www.digitalinclusionindex.org.au</u>). Among these are people on low incomes, those living in regional areas, people with a disability or significant health issue, people living alone, people with lower levels of education.

We believe everybody should be able to learn about and access the online services and platforms that connect our world.

Digital Inclusion Grants

The Wyatt Trust is inviting applications for grants of up to \$15,000 to improve digital inclusion for South Australians on low incomes, with priority given to projects that work with digitally excluded groups.

Through this granting program we will support South Australians to:

- Have access to data and/or devices (at home or in a local community place)
- Increase in digital confidence
- Increased in digital skills
- Be able to connect safely
- Be connected and using technology to manage daily life

In your application, please tell us which of the outcomes above your project will be helping to achieve and how you will go about measuring that participants are experiencing change. If uncertain, please contact Wyatt for support prior to submitting your application.

Who can apply?

Applications are invited from individuals or groups, with a registered ABN, working in community to improve digital inclusion for South Australians on low incomes.



In your application, please address the following points:

- Tell us about your community, who are you aiming to assist with the grant
- What barriers are they facing to digital inclusion?
- What resources, supports or opportunities would address these barriers?
- How will this grant complement other programs or services being offered around digital inclusion?
- How many people in your community would you expect to be assisted by this grant?
- How will you measure and report change in regard to digital inclusion experienced by the individuals this grant assists?

Applications need to meet the following criteria:

- Approved grants must directly benefit people in South Australia experiencing inequality or financial disadvantage in your community, particularly in relation to digital inclusion.
- A focus on reflection and learning, including outcomes for individuals in your community.
- Process to ensure that participants meet Wyatt eligibility (residents of South Australia for at least five years and low-income).

Please note that if demand is high, priority will be given to projects that focus on regional communities, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Communities, or people experiencing digital exclusion.
